

# The Fataleka NT is Finished

**UPDATE from the Bruners** • **JULY 2017** 



n 2010 we arrived in Papua New Guinea (PNG) after completing work on the Bughotu New Testament in the Solomon Islands. John then began making regular trips back to the Solomons to work as an advisor and consultant for the Fataleka New Testament translation project. We're happy to say that the Fataleka NT is finished, printed, and the 2000 copies have arrived in the Solomons in advance of the dedication that will happen on September 16th.

I (Brena) am so excited to be able to return to the Solomons with John for the dedication! While it has been seven years since we left, the Solomons definitely feels like home to me, so I'm eager to get back. We'll only be there a week but in that time I'll be able to reconnect with our friends and colleagues and also witness the happy event of the Fataleka people receiving God's Word in their own language. The audio recording will also be available, which will be wonderful for those who are unable to read. Unfortunately we won't have time to go out to the village we lived in while working with the Bughotu people because it is on a different island and ship travel is slow.

esides the Fataleka translation project, John has also been helping to consultant check portions of Scripture for languages here in PNG and oversee the internships of a number of men and women who are training to become

translation consultants. This last year he also began involvement in a Bible School in the Solomons that was started by Dr. Alpheaus Zobule, who we have known for over 20 years. John taught students how to use translation software and later this year he plans



to do consultant checking for some projects the school is involved with. John enjoys his work and also being able to play tennis and other sports year round and go on motorbike rides with Luke.


